The library strives to provide a forum for timely community conversations around issues that Cape residents care about. To that end, we are developing a slate of conversations to be hosted in 2021. If your department or committee is interested in partnering with us to host a virtual conversation, please read on!

We are planning to host 6 conversations over the course of the year. These will be scheduled in the evenings from 6:30 to 7:30 or 8:00, depending on the need for presenting content and accommodating discussion. TML staff will work with groups to create library publicity and host the events (virtually or in person, depending on public health considerations) and be available to help facilitate the meeting platform and conversation.

## **Identifying Opportunities for Dialogue**

- What is the issue you would like to create dialogue/provide information about?
- What would that look like?

- What would a successful program outcome be for you?
