

## Shelter Drive

In conjunction with our book launch party for **Still a Family**, by Brenda Reeves Sturgis, the Thomas Memorial Library is collecting items to donate to area homeless shelters.

### Preble Street Resource Center

Preble Street Resource Center is the hub of services for hundreds of homeless people in Portland—meeting urgent needs at an on-site clothing closet, soup kitchen, and food pantry; coordinating hours with the City of Portland Men's Shelter, a block away on Oxford Street; and providing direct access to casework services.

#### **Florence House**

Florence House provides safe, supported permanent housing to chronically homeless women in Portland, Maine.

#### **Teen Center**

The Preble Street Teen Center provides services for homeless and runaway youth, helping to meet immediate needs—warmth and safety, nutritious meals, clothing, and crisis intervention—while offering them the opportunity to develop life skills that promote stability and independence.

#### **Toiletries Drive**

There are shower facilities in the day shelters at Florence House, the Teen Center, and the adult Resource Center. Having a supply of toiletries available for our neighbors in need is very helpful. Travel sizes are best because folks have very limited storage capacity.
