We are partnering with the Town's DEI Committee to offer a Human Library event this fall, at which people will have the opportunity to engage in one-on-one or small group conversations with a Human Book--someone who belongs to a group in society that has experienced stigma, stereotyping, or prejudices. The topics for our Human Books might be based on ethnicity, religious belief, gender, mental and physical health, lifestyle, disability, or traumatic experiences.

Become a Human Book!

If you are at least 18 years old, have experienced some form of prejudice--or are a spouse or family member of someone who has-- please consider volunteering to become a Human Book. Currently, we have ten volunteers from our community and neighboring areas who have committed to be Human Books for our event, but we would love to have more!

If you've ever felt that world could use a little more understanding and empathy around issues of disability, addiction, economic status, gender identity, chronic illness, race, ethnicity, and any number of other identities and situations, this event offers you an opportunity to help make a difference.

Human Book volunteers will be trained through the Human book Organization, and well-cared for during our day-long event, scheduled for Saturday, October 14.
