#### INDIA STREET: IMMIGRATION & INNOVATION

Saturday, September 9: 10:00 am - 12:00 pm

Meet at intersection of Congress and India Streets in Portland

This tour through Portland's oldest neighborhood encompasses the full sweep of the city's fascinating history, focusing on the mid-19th to early 20th century, when it was home to a diverse population of Irish, Italian and Jewish immigrants and one of the nation's oldest free black communities – all living next to the wharves, train yards and factories that were the city's economic engine.



#### HOMES OF PORTLAND'S GOLDEN AGE

Meet at intersection of Spring and High Streets, across the street from the Portland Museum of Art

Explore the architecture and history of the Spring Street/State Street neighborhood. Once considered "the most beautiful neighborhood in Portland," this area was home to many of the city's wealthy and powerful in the 19th century. Hear stories about stately homes such as Victoria Mansion, Safford House, today's Cumberland Club, and their inhabitants.



#### EASTERN CEMETERY TOUR

Meet at Eastern Cemetery on Congress Street in Portland

Volunteers from Spirits Alive, a non-profit organization dedicated to the protection and preservation the Eastern Cemetery, will take us through the oldest historic landscape in Portland. Established in 1668, the cemetery is home to around 4,000 interred. We'll learn about the history and significance of this fascinating landmark.
